

Dear Parishioners,

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Baptism of the Lord. *JESUS* undertakes a baptism for the repentance of sin. Likely, this gives us pause. Jesus Christ is supposed to be the *sinless one*. Why would he receive baptism? What is it to be forgiven? The early Church asked these exact questions. Professing Jesus as the God-man, they knew that Jesus didn't need forgiveness.

Thus, our forbears saw in Jesus' baptism the sanctification of all water for the sake of *our baptism*.

Entering into the chaos of the waters, Jesus quells this chaos: Psalm 17 says..."the waters saw you, God; the waters saw you and lashed about, even the deeps of the seas trembled."

Now....when we descend into the waters of baptism, we find *CHRIST THERE!* Dying to sin & death, we rise with Christ to new life. The blessed waters become a source of healing for us. But how? How does Christ's descent into the waters save us?

Here, we must pick up on another thread... from Jesus's baptism. Although Jesus is the sinless one, although he has no need of forgiveness, *HE casts his lot with sinners*.





A warm greeting is extended to all who have come to worship with our community of faith. We are grateful for our faithful parishioners who are here every week. We also welcome all our visitors and invite you to consider joining our parish. If you are not Catholic, we encourage you to contact our Parish Office for information about becoming a member of the Church.

PARISH REGISTRATION We always welcome new parishioners to St. Teresa of Avila Parish. Registration will be held in the vestibule of the Church after all Masses on the 1st weekend of each month. You may call or visit the Parish Office on weekdays during business hours to register.

BAPTISM is usually celebrated on the 1st and 3rd Sundays of the month at 12:00. Please call or visit the Parish Office on Monday—Wednesday from 9am to 2:30 pm at 610-666-5820. Parents must attend our Pre-Jordan Class prior to their child's baptism. We look forward to helping you to prepare for this beautiful sacrament of the beginning of our life (of grace) in Christ.

MATRIMONY: Couples must make arrangements for matrimony in person with the parish clergy at least *nine* months prior to date of their anticipated wedding ceremony. One of the parties must have family registered in the parish at the time the couple comes to make arrangements. Please call the Parish Office for an appointment with the parish clergy.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: The sacrament of the anointing of the sick is based on Jesus' concern for the sick, his commissioning of the apostles to heal the sick and the healing ministry of the early Church. This sacrament is usually administered after the celebration of Mass or if needed during a personal visit. Parishioners who are entering the hospital for surgery, are seriously ill or desire the comfort of the sacrament in their weakness are encouraged to receive the Sacrament of the Sick. BAPTISMAL DEATH AND RESURRECTION



As we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord, we also honor our own baptism as our initiation into the Christian life and community. In the Gospel, the baptism of Jesus, with his immersion and then emergence from the water, points to his later

submission to God at his death, and his emergence from the grave at his resurrection. This pattern of death and resurrection is our path too, as followers of Jesus. Throughout life, often in small ways, we learn to surrender our limited and self-centered agendas. This surrender often feels like death. The sacrament of Baptism ritually enacts this pattern to remind us of Jesus' death and resurrection, so that we too might embrace the deaths and resurrections of our own lives. As Jesus emerged from the water, he encountered his Father and the Holy Spirit. Like Jesus, we can know we are God's beloved, empowered by the Spirit.
